Courses may be chosen from a variety of disciplines, as shown below, as well as upper-division courses from non-English language disciplines. No more than two courses can be used from a single discipline and at least one course must be chosen from one of the disciplines in the School of Social Transformation (AFR, APA, SST or WST). The related area courses may not be used concurrently in the major. However, in order to facilitate and encourage the student's completion of a minor, approved courses for the related area may be used in the minor.
